State Programs and Contests:

Wreath/Lawn Ornament Contest

Create a wreath or lawn ornament that you have created to display in your home and/or lawn.

- 1) Wreath and Lawn Ornaments may be for any season/holiday.
- 2) Wreaths and Lawn Ornaments will be judged and awarded 1st – 3rd place.
- 3) Entries will be silent auctioned off at state session. Bids open Friday evening, closes Sunday Morning.

Criteria for Judging:

- 1) Craftsmanship and skill
- 2) Presentation of subject
- 3) Originality
- 4) Theme and its treatment

Holiday Treat Contest

Show some Grange hospitality and win a People's Choice award with your favorite holiday treat.

Rules:

- A. All entries will be served to attendees of the convention, with votes taken and tallied for the winner.
- B. Holiday treats can be, but not limited to, cookies, snack mix, peanut brittle, anything that you make for any holiday gathering.

- C. Please bring your treat in at least 25 snack sized bags, labeled with the name of your entry EX: "Harvest Crunch Mix"
- D. Please also bring a list of ingredients/recipe to be posted above your holiday treat.

State Photo Contest

- A. Photos entered at state shall be entered in physical form.
 - a. Minimum of 4x6 – Maximum of 8x10
 - b. Photos should be mounted on a plain, light colored matboard. 4-H mounting will be accepted. Please do not submit entries in a frame.
- B. Divisions – there are four divisions:
 - a. Abandoned Buildings
 - b. Clouds
 - c. Monuments
 - d. State, County, or Community Fair
- C. Age Categories
 - a. Junior (5-13)
 - b. Youth (14-21)
 - c. Adult (22+)
- D. Each individual is limited to entering a total of three (3) photos.
- E. Entries should be no more than one (1) year old.
- F. On the back of mount board should include member name, Grange Name and Number, Division, and Age Category

- A. 250-650 words, typed, single spaced, on 8 ½" x 11" paper
- B. Title and author's identification are not included in the word count.
- C. Entries must be the original work of the person submitting
- D. All entries must be properly labeled in the header for judging with the following information – Name, Address, Grange Name/Number

Rules:

- A. Books may only be used once per bingo sheet
- B. Bring completed bingo sheet to state session to be entered into a drawing.
 - a. A completed bingo sheet is at least five in a row (across, down, diagonal)
- C. Write the name of the book you read in each square.
- D. Books may be in audio, eBook or physical format
- E. Books must be read between January 1 and the start of State Session (September 29)
- F. Juniors only: May be read to by an adult

- F. All entries will be retained by the National Grange to be made into finished quilts and other items to be sold at a later date.
- G. A 2024 Quilt Block Contest Entry Form must be completed for the block to be judged.

RULES

J. Entries should be no more than one (1) year old.

K. Any photograph deemed inappropriate will not be judged or exhibited in the National Grange Virtual Photo Contest.

L. Any entries received after the September 1, 2024 deadline will not be judged.

PRIZES

2024 National Grange Garden Design Contest

STATEMENT OF INTENT

Share gardening experiences, large or small, that connect us to the larger picture of agriculture, growing and nurturing plants for a variety of purposes.

RULES

- A. The National Grange Garden Design Contest is open to everyone.
- B. All contest entries must be received by the National Grange Lecturer by September 1, 2024. Submit entries at: <http://bit.ly/grangegarden2024>
- C. All entries must be received electronically as a single PDF file. (If you need assistance creating a PDF file, please email National Grange Communications Director Philip Vonada at pvonada@nationalgrange.org)
- D. Groups and Divisions: 1. Individual Junior Grange (age 5 – 14) a. Container Garden b. Raised Bed Garden c. Ground Space Garden 2. Individual Adult (age 14 +) a. Container Garden b. Raised Bed Garden c. Ground Space Garden 3. Group (all ages) a. Container Garden b. Raised Bed Garden c. Ground Space Garden
- E. Definitions: a. Raised Bed Garden: Raised beds are freestanding garden beds constructed above ground level. "Raised bed" means that the soil level in the bed is higher than the surrounding soil and implies a size small enough to work in without stepping onto planting area. Raised beds are enclosed with box-like frames to provide structural support and prevent erosion and may be constructed using a variety of materials. Beds can also be elevated for gardeners who want to avoid bending to the ground while working. b. Container Garden: A container garden can be a single pot with one or more plants in it, or several containers with multiple plants in each or a single plant per container, or a mixture of containers with various configurations of plant mixtures. Containers may be pots made from a variety of materials, baskets, planters or other objects that work effectively as a home for garden plants. 2024 National Grange Garden Design Contest c. Ground Space: any area of a ground level space cordoned off for growing garden plants (fruits, vegetables, flowers and other plant materials). Plants must be directly planted into the soil. Configurations of this garden plot may be in rows, square foot or broadcast.
- F. Entries must include a written description that includes: a. Name of gardener, Group and Division (ex. Individual Adult: Container) Grange name, number and location, contact information including mailing address, email address, and phone number. b. Purpose of the Garden: examples include purposes such as: herbs, produce for fresh use, produce for preserving, gifting, cut flowers, pollinators, etc.) c. List of all plant varieties in the garden: (ex. Early Girl Tomato, Malabar Spinach, d. Three photographs: one at the completion of planting, one mid-season and one in late August.
- G. Any entries received after the September 1, 2024 deadline will not be judged. H. Winners will be announced at the National Grange convention in Bettendorf, IA.

PRIZES

Monetary prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each Division. Ribbons will be awarded to all entrants.

 - a. Entry information
 - b. Completed Weather Watcher Form from September 1, 2024– August 31, 2024)
- E. Any entries received after the September 1, 2024 deadline will not be judged.
- F. Winners will be announced at the National Grange convention in Niagara Falls, New York.

2024 National Grange Lecturer's Design-a-Program Contest

STATEMENT OF INTENT

Grange Lecturers are frequently designing and creating programs for their home Granges and communities. We encourage Grange members to share these programs and the steps they take so that other Granges could potentially replicate the programming without "reinventing the wheel."

RULES

- A. The National Grange Lecturer's Design-a-Program Contest is open to any Grange member – not just Lecturers.
 - a. Any program, event, fundraiser, educational event, speaker, or game are acceptable. Think outside of the box
 - b. This program is open to Pomona, Subordinate/Community, and Junior Granges, as well as Statewide departments (Youth, Junior, Community Service, etc.)
- B. All contest entries must be received by the National Grange Lecturer by September 1, 2024. Submit entries at: <http://grange.biz/grangeprogram2024>
- C. All entries must be received electronically as a single file. (If you need assistance creating a PDF file, please email National Grange Communications Director Philip Vonada at pvonada@nationalgrange.org)
- D. Divisions
 - a. Internal Grange program for Adults
 - b. External Community program for Adults
 - c. Program designed for children
- E. Entries must include a written description that includes:
 - a. The format of the event (lecture, hands-on, fundraiser, etc.)
 - b. Goal of the program (what did you intend as the main takeaway by attendees)
 - c. Detailed plan for the program, including any preparations done in advance
 - d. Specific materials needed
 - e. Time required (Preparation, program, clean-up)
 - f. Length of program
 - g. Minimum number of participants needed (both for creating/carrying out the program/event, and for taking part in the program/event)
 - h. Summary of how the program was received and any feedback from attendees
 - i. Link(s) to any videos, PowerPoints/slideshows, or multimedia used during the event.
 - j. 2-3 photos of the program/event happening
- F. Judging criteria is as follows:
 - a. Informative and factual (30 points)

- b. Interest Factor (20 points)
 - c. Interactive/engagement potential (15 points)
 - d. Creativity in concept (15 points)
 - e. Professional (grammar, language, approach, etc. (10 points)
 - f. Reflective of Grange principles/values/issues of interest (10 points)
- G. Any entries received after the September 1, 2024 deadline will not be judged.
- H. Winners will be announced at the 158th National Grange convention in Bettendorf, Iowa.
- I. By entering this contest, you understand that your program may be posted on the National Grange website for use by other Lecturers.

PRIZES

- Monetary prizes will be awarded to the host Grange for 1st (\$100), 2nd (\$75), and 3rd (\$50) place in each Division.
- Ribbons will be awarded to all entrants.
